IMPORTANT NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

The Society has appointed a specific team of Stewards - Stewards of Safety - to supervise the implementation of these measures which will control the movement of people and livestock to and from different areas of the Show Grounds. **THE DIRECTIONS OF THE STEWARDS OF SAFETY MUST BE FOLLOWED AT ALL TIMES.**

It is in your own interests to comply with all instructions and to observe the procedures laid down and the Society would appreciate your full co-operation in this. However, should any exhibitor refuse to comply with the instructions of the Stewards of Safety, The Society will have no alternative but to immediately remove from the Show Grounds that exhibitor's entries and all fees paid or prizes won will be forfeit. This condition will be strictly enforced and no appeal will be entertained.

Details of the routes to be taken from stabling areas to the various showing and jumping rings will be prominently displayed at the Show. You are urged to familiarise yourself with these and to seek the advice/assistance of the Stewards of Safety if you are in doubt about any aspect of this matter. By Order of Show Council.
